

NEO NORTE 5.0 ARRIVES AT THE MEMORIAL DA AMÉRICA LATINA TO INVITE THE PEOPLE OF SAO PAULO TO SUGGEST THE SOUTH TO BECOME THE NEW NORTH

- A proposal that revolutionises the way of conceiving public art commissions, through a textile recycling campaign, an artistic residency, a seminar, a series of performances, and an exhibition created for and with the Latin American community.
- The project, curated by Tere Chad, will be presented in Sao Paulo, Brazil, between August 2025 and January 2026.

Neo Norte, now in its fifth edition, arrives in Sao Paulo as a participatory cultural project that uses textile upcycling and performance to reimagine the cultural values of the South that we wish to export to the world. After nearly three years of work, made possible through two crowdfunding campaigns, with the support of the Fundação Memorial da América Latina amongst other partners, the project becomes a reality.

The production of **Neo Norte 5.0** will take place between **20 August 2025 and 18 January 2026**, mainly at the **Memorial da América Latina** (Av. Mário de Andrade, 664, Barra Funda, 01156-001, near the Barra Funda Terminal, Sao Paulo, SP - Brazil), also including some activities in associated venues. The programme includes an artistic residency for around 40 artists (6 Nov – 7 Dec), with a textile upcycling marathon (re-use of discarded fabrics), a series of community workshops, mentorships with specialists, a seminar (18 Nov), three performances (29 Nov, 3 Dec, and 4 Dec), and an exhibition at the Marta Traba Gallery (4 Dec – 18 Jan), located within the Memorial complex.

-"Neo Norte arises from a question and a realisation: Latin America and other continents of the Southern Hemisphere are less celebrated and studied than those of the opposite hemisphere. This enquiry, however, is not confined to a symbolic gesture — it is transformed into concrete practice through an extensive programme that includes an exhibition, community workshops, performances, a seminar, and an artistic residency. By occupying the Memorial for six months, the project reaffirms the institution not merely as a space for exhibition but as an active museological centre of Latin American identity, bringing together research, education, curatorship, technological innovation, and community participation. Neo Norte 5.0 began its developed in stages throughout 2024, to celebrate the 35th anniversary of the Memorial da América Latina, aligning itself with the new guidelines of the Environmental Memorial in the context of COP 30, to be held in Brazil in 2025. —'Latin America is part of the climate solution. It is a region with natural resources, energy, forests, agriculture. But we also know that Latin America is highly vulnerable to climate change, suffering from droughts, floods, and heatwaves,' - stated Ana Toni, CEO of COP 30, during the UNFCCC Climate Week in Panama (21.05.25), a preparatory forum for COP 30.

Considering that the Brás district produces around 45 tonnes of textile waste daily - the equivalent of 16 lorries of rubbish, (MODEFICA, FGVces, REGENNERATE. Fios da Moda: Perspectiva Sistêmica Para Circularidade. São Paulo, 2020)- **Neo Norte 5.0** invites creatives from the fields of humanities, visual arts, fashion, and performance to offer solutions to transform this waste into artworks that celebrate the cultural values Latin America offers the world to face climate change and the challenges of the 21st century. Neo Norte is an artistic and research project under development since 2017, inspired by the legacy of the Uruguayan artist **Joaquín Torres García**, suggesting the South to become the New North.

The Chilean curator and artist **Tere Chad**, the youngest member and the only Latin American on the board of the Royal Society of Sculptors, has presented the project in four countries, involving more than 80 artists and attracting 565,000 visitors. Neo Norte explores four main subthemes: migrations as creative destructions, cultural syncretism, the integration of the digital with the natural environment, and shamanism from a pre-Columbian and Western perspective.



Tere Chad employs a 'collage' curatorial methodology, integrating ethnic, folk, and Western languages. The curator's role in this process permeates collaboration with the artists in a horizontal way.

- Neo Norte 1.0 was exhibited at the Fundación Cultural de Providencia, Santiago (Chile, 2018);
- Neo Norte 2.0, presented at Exposed Arts Projects, London (UK, 2019);
- Neo Norte 3.0, at Myymälä2 Gallery, Helsinki (Finland, 2021);
- **Neo Norte 4.0** (Italy, 2023–2024), consisted of inscribing the Chakana the Southern Cross in the centre of the Mediterranean, through a performance at Villa Giulia (Palermo, Sicily) and a land art installation at the Archaeological Park of Segesta (Sicily).

Neo Norte 5.0 seeks to reimagine the journey of the South and the Memorial's collection through participatory upcycling and performance. The project has already developed two symposia (2024) and an extension course (2025), in partnership with Professor Wilton García, FATEC Itaquaquecetuba, Centro Paula Souza.
